Dave Bucciero is the head coach of the American University women's soccer program. Prior to joining AU, he was the associate head coach at Boston University. During his tenure, the Terriers went 73-37-14, captured four America East Championships and made five NCAA Tournament appearances. Bucciero also assisted in developing 15 America East All-Conference First Team Selections and helped lead the program to its highest ranking ever in 2006, as the Terriers were ranked No. 10 in the country. Bucciero has also been actively involved in the Region 1 Girls Olympic Development Program as both a goalkeeper and team coach. He is currently the Under-14 Region 1 Girls Head Coach as well as the Co-Head Coach of the Goalkeeper Program. His responsibilities include evaluating and selecting the Under-14 Regional Team and evaluating potential goalkeeper coaches for the Region 1 Program. He also holds both a USSF "A" License and an NSCAA Advanced License.

About the Advanced Skills Overnight Camp

The camp is designed for girls interested in playing soccer at the collegiate level. Players will be exposed to college coaches with an emphasis on high level training and preparation for the collegiate game. Some of the technical areas that will be covered include: Long ball service, heading, finishing to goal, crossing, 1v1 defending, and 1v1 attacking. Tactical areas that will be covered include: movement off the ball, runs in the box, proper marking in the box, and team shape offensively and defensively. Every camper will receive a written evaluation from her coach at the end of the week with ideas of how to improve as a player.

Housing and Meals

Campers are housed in campus dormitories at American University. All dorms are air-conditioned and you may request a roommate for the week. The American University dining services will provide breakfast, lunch, and dinner each day. The staff will also be housed in the dorms and provide 24 hour supervision.

Camp Staff

Location

The Dave Bucciero Advanced Skills Overnight Camp will take place on the campus of American University at the Massachusetts Avenue soccer field, Tenley Field, and Jacobs field. In case of inclement weather, camp will take place indoors on campus.

What to Bring

Along with the necessary clothing and personal items for the overnight camp, the following must be brought to camp:

- Proper footwear, including cleats and shin guards
- Goalkeeper padded shirts and gloves (goalkeepers only)
- Sneakers and/or indoor athletic shoes
- Soccer ball labeled with camper's name
- Water bottle

Athletic Trainers/Medical Insurance

There will be an athletic trainer on site during all sessions to care for all injuries. All campers must have proof of personal medical insurance. In the event of illness or injury requiring treatment, hospitalization, or surgery, family medical insurance must be used. Routine health care will be provided by the camp athletic trainer; however, staff will not dispense aspirin or other medications, unless instructed to do so. Although every attempt will be made to contact parents or guardians in case of emergency, the medical treatment authorization/release portion of the registration form must be signed to grant permission for any medical attention needed to be authorized by the camp director or athletic trainer.

Registration and Tuition

Tuition is \$500.00 per camper. This fee includes housing, all meals, and a Nike camp t-shirt.

Fee discounts:

- If campers come with a friend, \$25 discount for each camper
- Children of American University faculty and staff receive a \$25 discount
- \$75 discount for local campers who do not spend the night at American University
